

The University of Toledo is seeking candidates for the newly created role of Deputy General Counsel Health Sciences (DGC).

Reporting to the Vice President and General Counsel, Peter Papadimos, the Deputy General Counsel will be responsible for providing legal advice to the University of Toledo on health care matters including the Health Science Colleges of the University, the University of Toledo Medical Center, the physician practice plan and clinics and major affiliates. As a highly visible and engaged member of the legal team, this executive will be responsible for a wide range of legal, regulatory, and transactional projects and will manage the legal resources in a manner that supports the overall health care related priorities of the University of Toledo. The DGC will be expected to provide a proactive and collaborative approach to the legal framework of the health care related issues associated with the University of Toledo including the long-term Academic Affiliation Agreement with ProMedica.

The UT Health Science Campus is home to the colleges of Medicine and Life Sciences, Nursing, Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences, and some programs from the College of Health and Human Services. Also on the campus is the 267-bed University of Toledo Medical Center (UTMC), a major patient-care referral and teaching facility owned and operated by the University. The medical center's outpatient care system and the physicians' private practice plan, University of Toledo Physicians LLC, also are located there. The medical center is at the forefront of health care, providing patients with the most progressive, state-of-the-art treatments and medical technology available. In 2015, ProMedica and the University of Toledo College of Medicine finalized an academic affiliation agreement that will enable the two organizations to develop one of the nation's leading academic medical centers. The 50-year, multi-billion dollar agreement provides for substantially all of the college's learners to be placed at ProMedica facilities.

The successful candidate must have excellent academic credentials, a law degree from an ABA accredited school of law, membership in the State Bar of Ohio or eligibility for admission based on reciprocity is required and an outstanding record of achievement with at least five (5) years of health care law experience gained in-house or through working closely with complex health care clients. Specific experience working in an integrated healthcare delivery system or academic medical center is preferred.
