

## **Assistant Professor of Law**

The University of Oregon School of Law invites applications for an assistant professor focusing on civil rights, to begin in August 2019.

The School of Law is an ABA accredited law school and Oregon's only public law school, made up of three graduate degree programs and an undergraduate legal studies program.

Minimum qualifications include a record of academic excellence, demonstrated success or the potential for success in scholarship and teaching, and a JD from an accredited law school or its equivalent. Applicants must have scholarship, teaching, and/ or practice expertise in civil rights and related fields. Successful candidates must have strong interpersonal skills sufficient to inspire and work effectively with diverse groups of faculty, students, staff, alumni, and members of the bar.

For full consideration, application materials should be submitted by September 15, 2018, although submissions will be accepted until the positions are filled. Applicants should submit a letter of interest, a current resume, a description of their research agenda, a statement addressing their potential contribution(s) to diversity, equity and inclusion, and references via MyTracks: <http://careers.uoregon.edu/cw/en-us/job/522271/assistant-professor-of-law>.
