Multidistrict litigation (MDL) offers a path to resolve large, high-stake matters. MDLs dominate the federal court system—comprising over half the federal civil docket nationwide—and many states have MDL-like procedural devices to resolve complex disputes. More recently, judges and practitioners have called for increased diversity among counsel appointed to highly sought-after MDL leadership positions. This panel will discuss the nuts and bolts of, and recent trends in, MDLs including factors driving when to seek (or avoid) an MDL, strategies for successfully creating, managing and resolving an MDL, and efforts to increase the number of diverse attorneys leading MDLs.	This panel will begin with a discussion, from a compliance officer's perspective, of the corruption issues and other problems that often end in either arbitration or litigation. The program will then consider how such issues are dealt with in arbitration and litigation. This program will review practical measures that compliance officers can take for understanding and handling such problems and how arbitration and litigation practitioners can work with them to address such problems in the face of a dispute. The program will also consider the potential benefit of confidentiality in arbitration proceedings and the challenges of dealing with different cross-border regimes, in particular, those of Europe and Latin America.	Distinguished panelists of voting rights practitioners will discuss national and local trends in voting law and voter suppression issues providing insight on dangerous legal theories and tactics that seek to undermine longstanding voter protections embodied in the law. Panelists will discuss how recent federal court actions have impacted traditional litigation strategies, how they have adapted to safeguard existing voter protections, and how they have strategized to overcome such limitations.
